4.1 Conclusion

Finally, the teacher encourages students to memorize at least five new words daily, which will gradually enhance their vocabulary and introduce them to unfamiliar terms.

4.2.1 For English Teachers

For this reason, teachers can also employ additional strategies, such as having students pronounce newly learned vocabulary correctly to avoid pronunciation errors and boost students' confidence.

1.2.2 For Future Researcher

In this study, the researcher used a structured approach method in which students were required to answer only a set of questions that the researcher had carefully designed and presented. This strategy was created to create a controlled setting in which students could focus on articulating their thoughts and feelings in response to instructions, allowing the researcher to collect particular data on their perspectives and experiences with speaking English. The researcher is hoping that future research may reveal other benefits or tactics that can boost students' confidence when speaking English.

Understanding the factors that influence students' confidence is critical in developing
effective teaching approaches customized to their requirements.

Identifying specific tactics that connect with students allows instructors to employ practices that build a more supportive learning environment, ultimately encouraging students to express themselves more freely in English. The study's concentration on qualitative methodologies increases its relevance and applicability.
